Never before had newsmen reported the incoming news in such a moment changing climate. There isn't a person alive today who lived through those storms that doesn't give credit to God for saving their lives or the lives of their loved ones. We have much to be thankful for. Take a moment today to think of how God put the right people in the right place that night of May 6, 1965. It truly does take your breath away!

Don Hodges, 1965 Mayor of Moundsview, will also speak.


The open mike segment of the program will conclude with stories by some of the citizens from the community and what happened to them on that stormy night.

Fridley Its History and People



Have you ever unearthed family photos, knowing that those pictured are probably related to you, but been unable to identify them because no one took the time to label the pictures with names, places, or dates?

The unidentified photos in our archive could fill several albums. For example, we have a packet of 14 photos (four are shown here) that are obviously connected to each other but are a mystery. We have no idea who those people are, whether that house is in Fridley, and why those family photos ended up with the Historical Society.

Can you identify anything about these photos? Most were developed in 1960 and 1961; the photo of the young boy says "kindergarten" on the back.

The folder that contains the photos has the name Halzhew (it's hard to read the writing so the ending might be different) as the customer; they were developed at Craben Brothers Pharmacy on the corner of 2nd Street and 13thAvenue NE. However, I suspect the folder doesn't match the photos, as it looks much older and indicates that it includes enlargements of 2 negatives.

If you can give us any information about these photos, please contact us through our website or leave a message at our history center. And don't forget to label your own photos -- not so much for you but for those who come after you.
